The aim of the Masters is to encourage more competitive running in UKA classes and improve the overall standard of top level agility in the UK. The Masters has been created for dogs and competitors whose goal is to compete at both National and International level. The Masters is also intended to attract the highest standard of judging over challenging agility and jumping courses.

General Rules • Open to all UKA Champion Level Performance dogs. • Separate competition for each height. • Agility and Jumping class with results combined. • Handlers must run in strict running orders, failure to do so will result in elimination. • Any late entries will run first. **Scoring** • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • Faults converted into seconds. 5 faults = 5 seconds. • Time faults treated the same as course faults. • An elimination = 100 faults. • Dogs eliminated will also be given the course time as their time. • Dogs with the lowest score will be deemed the winner. • In the event of a tie the result from the agility class will be the deciding factor. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility. **Final Qualification** • 10 Masters • 1st & 2nd Overall qualify for Final unless elimination in one class • 1st place in the agility or jumping round qualifies for final • The annual Masters final will be held at the UK Agility Grand Finals in December. • The final will follow the same format as the heats. **Prizes** • Entry fee = £12. • £7 placed in heat prize fund. • Each height has its own prize fund and will be divided as per masters "Prize Money Guide." • Winner of each Masters will gain the letters MA after their UKA name • £1 from each entry fee will be placed in the final prize fund. • At the final each height has its own prize fund and will be divided 1st = 50%, 2nd = 25%, 3rd = 15%, 4th = 10%. • Winner of the final will win the title of the UKA Masters Champion, a status that remains with the winning dog.

General Rules • Open to all Beginner and Novice dogs which are entered in the Agility and Jumping class on the day.
• There will be a separate competition for each height. • Agility and Jumping class with the results combined. • Course level should be Beginner/Novice. • Course time is to be Beginner rates of travel. • Each class to attain its own results and count towards UKA progression. **Scoring** • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • The dog with the least faults will be deemed the winner with time used as a tie break. • An elimination = 100 faults. • In the event of a tie the result from the Agility will be the deciding factor. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility.

Final Qualification • 10 Heats • Top 2 from each heat qualify for the Final. • The Final will be held at the UK Agility Grand Finals in December. • The Final will follow the same format as the heats.

Prizes • Rosettes for all qualifiers and Awards for Heat Winner • Rosettes for all Finalists • Awards for top 3 Finalists •

The top 3 in the Final will also receive
1st place £150 Tug-e-nuff voucher,
2nd place £50 Tug-e-nuff voucher, 3rd place £25 Tug-e-nuff voucher.

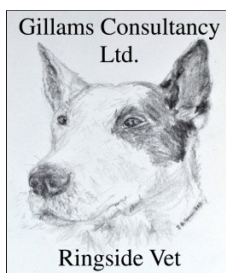
General Rules • Open to all dogs from Novice to Champion level. • There will be a separate competition for each height. • All levels will run over the same course with each level attaining its own results. • Course design level should be a Senior Agility course. • Course time calculated with Novice Rate of Travel. • The results of the 3 levels will then be combined. **Scoring** • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • The dog with the least faults will be deemed the winner with time used as a tie break. • An elimination = 100 faults. • In the event of a tie a runoff will be required. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility. **Final Qualification** • 10 Heats • Top 2 from each heat qualify for the Semi Final. • The top 10 from the Semi Final will progress to the Final. • The Semi Final & Final will be held at the UK Agility Grand Finals in December and follow the same rules as the heats.

General Rules • Open to all Beginner Steeplechase dogs. • There will be a separate competition for each height. • The class will consist of one steeplechase course counting towards normal UKA progression. **Scoring** • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • The dog with the least faults will be deemed the winner with time used as a tie break. • An elimination = 100 faults. • In the event of a tie a runoff will be required. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility. **Final Qualification** • 10 Heats • Top 2 from each heat qualify for the Semi Final. • The top 10 from the Semi Final will progress to the Final. • The Semi Final and Final will be held at the UK Agility Grand Finals in December and follow the same rules as the heats.

The UKA Junior Open Championship 2012

The aim of this competition is to encourage Junior handlers to compete in Agility and prepare them for their future competitions.

General Rules • Open to all handlers who are under 18 on the 1st December 2012. • Open to all levels and all heights running in one competition. • Agility and Jumping class with results combined. • Course level should be Beginner / Novice. • Course time is to be Beginner rates of travel for the Maxi and Standard with 2 seconds added for the Midi and Toy. **Scoring** • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • The results from each class will be combined with all faults (course and time faults) added to time and subtracted from the course time. • Time faults treated the same as course faults.

• Eliminations will score 100 faults and also be given standard course time. • The dog with the highest number left will be deemed the winner. • (E.g. Course time Maxi/Std = 50 seconds, Midi /Toy 52 seconds. Dog 1; Maxi, clear in 30 seconds = 20 points. Dog 2; Std, 5 faults in 31 seconds = 14 points. Dog 3; Midi, clear in 34 seconds = 18 points. Dog 4; Toy, eliminated = -100 points) • In the event of a tie the result from the agility will be the deciding factor. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility. **Final Qualification** • 10 Heats • Top 4 from each heat qualify for the Final. • Final will follow the same format as the heats.

General Rules • Open to all dogs from all levels and all heights. • Dogs of ANY different heights can be mixed within the pair. Toy and Midi dogs will run over Toy height and Standard and Maxi dogs will run over Standard height. Therefore the pair could consist of all dogs running Toy height or all dogs running Standard Height or 1 dog running Toy height and 1 dog running Standard height. • All pairs will be competing against each other in one competition. • Handlers may enter more than one pair. • Dogs may only compete in one pair in any heat • The course will consist of two separate sections, with one dog completing the Jumping section and the other dog completing the Agility section. • The dog running the Agility course must run first. • There will be a baton change between the first and second handler, which must take place behind a line. • The Jumping will be made up of jumps and tunnels. • The Agility should contain jumps, tunnels, dog walk, seesaw, and A-frame. • The weaves MUST be in either one or both sections; with no more than 15 obstacles per section. • At the time of course walking the Standard & Toy combined pairs must state which dog is doing which section so the ring crew can alter running order correctly.

Scoring • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • Faults converted into seconds. 5 faults = 5 seconds. • An eliminations = 100 faults. • A faulted baton change will incur 10 faults • Time faults treated the same as course faults. • The pair with the lowest score will be deemed the winner. • In the event of a tie a runoff will be required. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility. **Final Qualification** • 10 Heats • Top 2 pairs from each heat qualify for the Final. • The Final will be held at the UK Agility Grand Finals in December and follow the same format as the heats.

General Rules • Open to all dogs from all levels and all heights. • Teams to consist of 3 dogs made up of ANY combination of heights • All teams will be competing against each other in one competition. • There will be an Agility run and a 3 dog Team Relay • The Agility will follow standard Agility rules and be an individual run • The Team Relay will follow UK Agility rules with course design rules of WAO Team Speedstakes. (Each dog will perform 15 to 20 obstacles. An A frame and 12 pole weave must be included. All other equipment is allowed with the exception of Seesaw, Dog Walk and table.) • In the Team Relay Toy & Midi dogs will run at Toy height and Standard & Maxi dogs will run at Standard height. • Handlers may be entered in more than one team. • Dogs may only compete in one team in any heat. • Only 1 dog and/or 1 handler may be used as a reserve in the Final and the makeup of the team must adhere to the combination that qualified. **Scoring** • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • The results from the 3 individual Agility runs and the Team Relay will be combined • Faults converted into seconds. 5 faults = 5 seconds. • Time faults treated the same as course faults. • An eliminations = 100 faults. If a handler is eliminated they must make a sportsman like attempt to finish the course correctly failure to do so will incur 60 seconds being added to the team time. • A faulted baton change will incur 10 faults • The team with the lowest score will be deemed the winner. • In the event of a tie the team relay score will decide the winner. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility.

Final Qualification • 5 Heats • Top 2 teams from each heat qualify for the Final. • The Final will be held at the UK Agility Grand Finals in December. • The Final will follow the same format as the heats.

General Rules

- Open to ALL dogs from All levels.
- There will be a separate competition for each height.
- Handlers may enter more than one dog into a heat and qualify more than one dog for the Final.
- If a handler is drawn against him/herself in a heat they must nominate which dog progresses.
- Only handler and dog combinations that qualify in heats may run in the Final, unless more than one dog is qualified, in which case handlers may nominate a surrogate handler to run one of their dogs in the Final.
- A nominated handler must handle the dog for the duration of the Final.
- The course will be of circular design; however judges may put in deviations from the circle.
- The course may consist of any combination of jumps, tunnels, and weave poles.
- No contacts are permitted.
- There will be separate starting points for each competitor, either running clockwise or anticlockwise, which will be decided by the judge.
- There will be a judge for each dog.
- The main judge will start the heat with a whistle and have the overall decision on who progresses to the next round.
- Dogs will be issued with a running order that must be strictly adhered to.
- Failing to run when due will result in being knocked out and the other dog will go through to the next round.
- In the event of one dog catching up with their opponent the caught dog must give way.

Scoring

- Standard UK Agility Marking will apply.
- 5 Faults = 5 seconds.
- The time will start on the whistle and finishes as the dog crosses the line.
- An eliminations = 100 faults.
- The dog with the lowest score will be deemed the winner.
- Should both dogs be eliminated, the dog that was eliminated first will lose.
- In the event of a tie a runoff will be required.
- Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility.

Final Qualification

- 4 Heats
- Top 4 from each heat qualify for the Final.
- The Final will be held at the UK Agility Grand Finals in December.

General Rules • Open to all levels and all heights running in one competition. Only handler and dog combinations that gain three or more qualifying wins may run in the Final, • The final will consist of a Gamblers course and a Snooker course.

Scoring • Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. • Both Points and times will be combined from the 2 classes • The dog with the most points in the fastest time will be deemed the winner • In the event of a tie the competitor with the most Gamblers points in the fastest time will be deemed the winner. • Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UK Agility.

Final Qualification • Qualification for the 2012 Semi Final will be by winning 3 games classes with a qualifying score at any UKA show between 7th June 2011 – 2nd July 2012. The Semi Final to be held at the UKA Nationals Week show 2012 on Friday 3rd August • The top 20 from the Semi Final will qualify to compete at the Games Challenge Final to be held at UK Agility Grand Finals in December 2012

Prizes There will be rosettes and goody bags for all finalist, plus trophies for the overall winner and runner-up and individual rosettes and trophies for the winner of both the Snooker and the Gamblers sections.

UK AGILITY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS 2012 FINALS



Each height division will have its own separate competition. Round 1 of the National Finals is open to any dog that gains a clear round in ANY agility class, except Casual and Nursery, at any UK Agility Show from 1st September 2011 up to and including 30th July 2012. (The dog must be handled by the same handler.) A random draw will be made for Round 1. This running order will be displayed on the day and not on your running order card.

The top 50% of the class from Round 1 will then qualify for Round 2. If this is fewer than 25 then the top 25 will qualify for Round 2, providing they were not eliminated. In round 2 dogs will run in the reverse order of the result of round 1. The top 15 dogs in the class from Round 2 will then qualify to run in the Final. Running order for the final will be in the reverse order of round 2 result. Novice rates of travel will be used to work out the Standard course time for the 2 rounds and the Final. Round 1, Round 2, and the Final results do not count towards progression in UKA levels. (Round 1, 30th July, Round 2, 2nd August, Final 4th August.)
